Here, each of the little things we see or that are revealed makes up the wonderful world of the child that we discover at the end of the book, starting with the teddy bear on the cover, the thread running through the book..

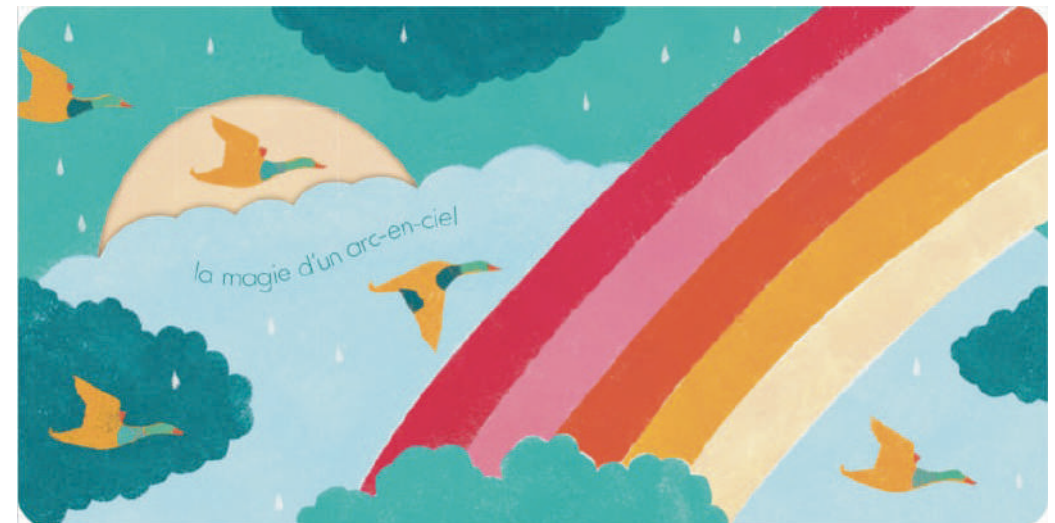


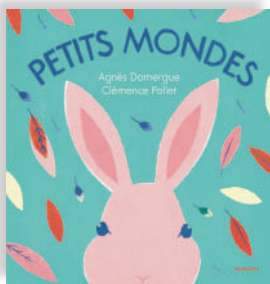
CLÉMENCE POLLET (illustrator)

Yes, to hear the wind, smell the perfumes. Then a mouth of a frog to taste the delights, the eyes of an owl to discover the night, and even the hand of a child to caress the bark of a tree. In other words... five senses like so many little worlds that a loving heart embraces all together as it grows.

A bird without a story

Driven away from a beautiful story, a bird finds itself alone in the snow. What to do? Search for food, make noise and slides, and find someone to tell all this to. But is it really important to have a story? Do all the falling snowflakes have one? Moreover, when you listen to them, all you hear is silence. And how beautiful is the silence that is listened to with this bird without a story.

With great economy of means, a true sense of situation, and a lot of humor, Catherine Louis addresses here, with simplicity and accuracy, the very young. A bit of torn paper, paint, pastel, and a whole world emerges. It's vast, she frames it; it's full of unknowns, she organizes the search; it's noisy with questions, she sets up the silence... gently. A joy to read to reassure the little ones and, perhaps, lead them to sleep when the time comes.

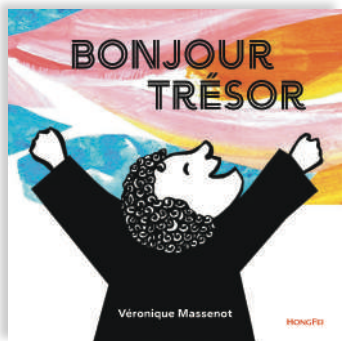


CATHERINE LOUIS

by Véronique Massenot

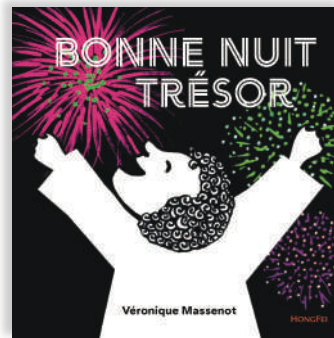

There is no doubt that their pleasure in advancing step by step in the exploration of the day will be even greater in the magnetic company of an adult.

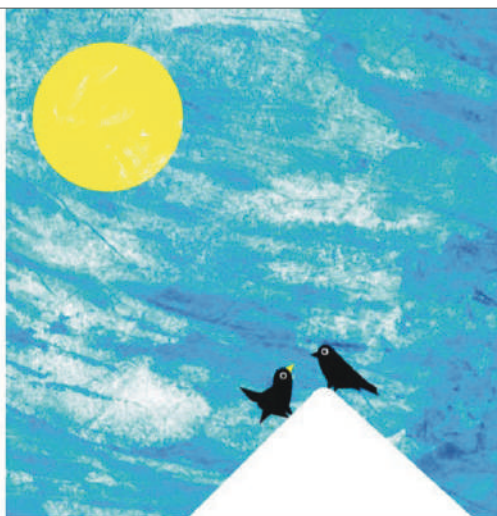
is filled with bright lights. He will not be disappointed by this poetic expedition, tinged with magic and celebration... What a dreamy night!

Winter vacation

For the little girl and her black cat, it's time for winter vacation... They've come a long way, and now they're on their way home. In a succession of scenes, they visit emblematic places that the illustrator has tinted with the childhood spirit of the two visitors. The vivid images evoke the biting cold, the joys of snow, the pleasure of

fluffy clothes, the happiness of bright nights, and each time seem to capture the moment, as if in a souvenir photograph.

In this picture book, Mori brings to life the story of a journey that begins and ends... back to Japan, where we guess the little girl lives. Behind her, on the shelves, are souvenirs that recall the precious moments of this winter's journey.

On one of the shelves, you'll even recognize *Summer Vacation*, Mori's first book (first published in France, then translated into several languages, including Chinese), in which the same little girl and her cat enjoy the pleasures of a summer spent... in Japan.

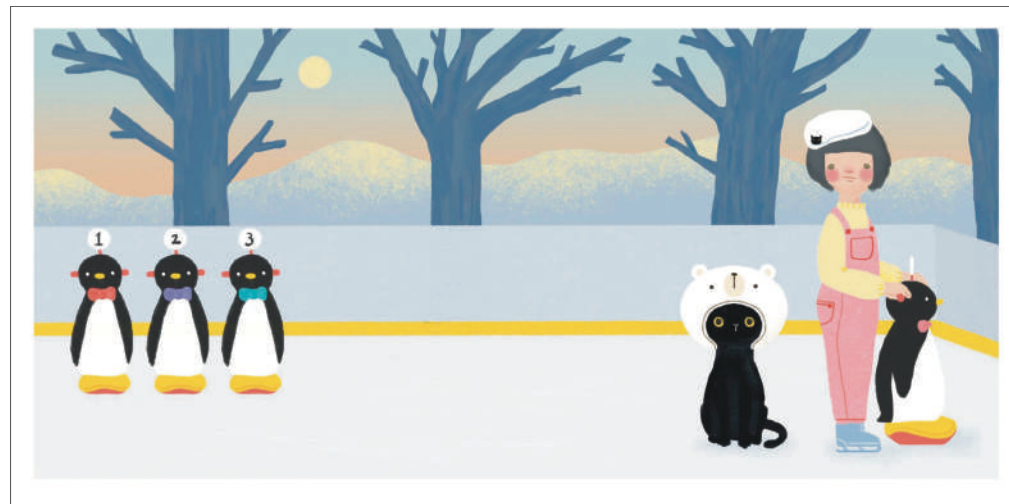
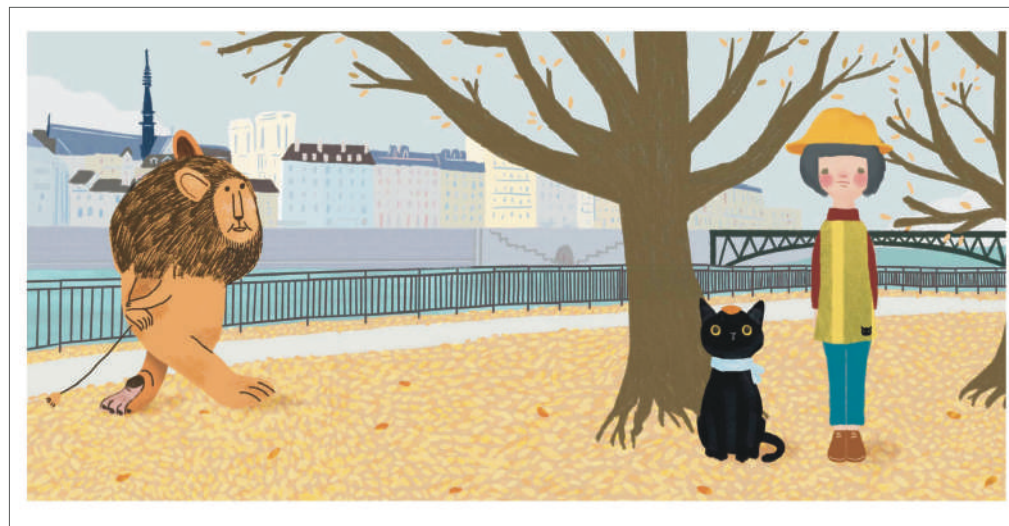
In *Winter Vacation*, Mori - who recently moved to France - also pays homage to two great figures of children's illustration whose work has crossed borders: Beatrice Alemagna, through an evocation of her *Lion in Paris* (*Lion à Paris*), and Tomi Ungerer with his *The Three Robbers* (*Les Trois Brigands*).

In 2019, HongFei published his first picture book *Summer Vacation* (on the right). It will be followed by *The River* (p. 19) in 2020 and *Papa's Little Truck* (p. 18) in 2021 (awarded as the best children's book of the year in Taiwan in its Chinese language version). His illustrations have already been selected and awarded by several major international prizes (such as merit Award for the 3x3 Illustration Show).

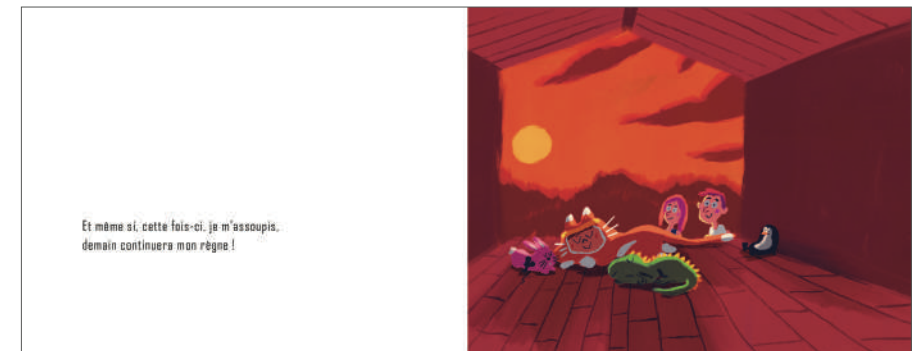
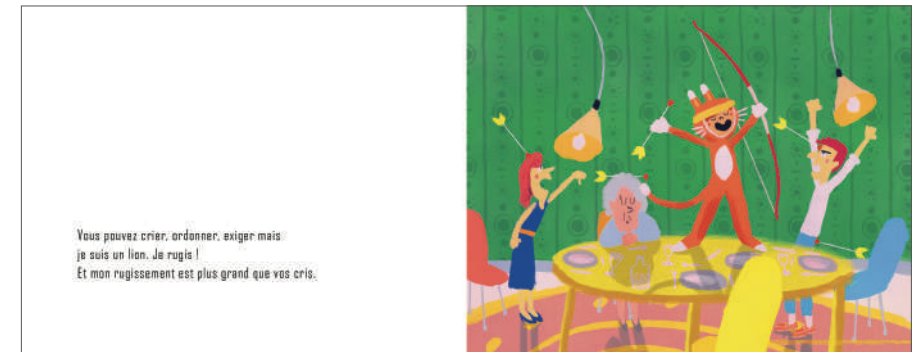
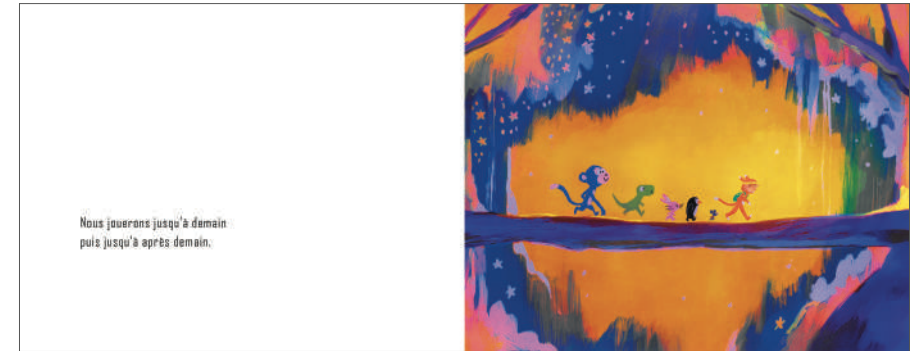
MORGANE DE CADIER

Once a food-lover, always a cook! A child understands that what makes him happy will make those he loves happy as well.

In Japan, Tomio's family calls him "the little gourmet". For his 7th birthday, his grandfather offered him a kitchen apron to wear while preparing the family recipes. Over time, the apron got dirty and tore, but it doesn't matter, because "cooking is life", as Grandpa - an excellent apron repairman, - says.

So, when his grandfather joins his ancestors, Tomio, who knows how to create happiness and share it, prepares a meal for the family. Before doing so, he sews a red heart onto his apron.

A touching story of transmission and self-fulfillment, with four of Tomio's recipes offered to readers at the end of the book.

MICKAËL JOURDAN studied at the École de l'Image in Angoulême, before devoting himself to illustration (publishing and press), running creative workshops and writing projects for children's books. In his images, he combines graphic and minimalist forms that, softened by the tenderness of the brush, depict spaces ideal for contemplation. Leaving an important place to nature and memories, he seeks visual and narrative constructions that get to the heart of the matter with few means.

Eugène, the boxing champion of France, arrives at the front in March 1915. There, a bullet hits him straight in the face. When the young man, nicknamed "Angel Face", wakes up from the brink of death, he is now a "Broken face." After months of rehabilitation, he recovers. Once the war is over, he decides to resume boxing. "The bullet that didn't kill him may have made him stronger": now known as "Iron Jaw," he bulks up, competes frequently, sometimes loses but often wins. Until June 2, 1923, in New York, where his impressive opponent struggles to get up. Eugène Criqui is the world champion!

Following *The Chess Player* (p.46), Frédéric Marais once again draws inspiration from a real character and trajectory to tell a powerful story and evoke the barely believable springs that lie deep within each of us. If Eugène returned to the ring "to everyone's surprise," he knew perfectly well what he had to accomplish, especially in a life slipping away from him. A superb lesson of dignity, full of modesty and elegance.

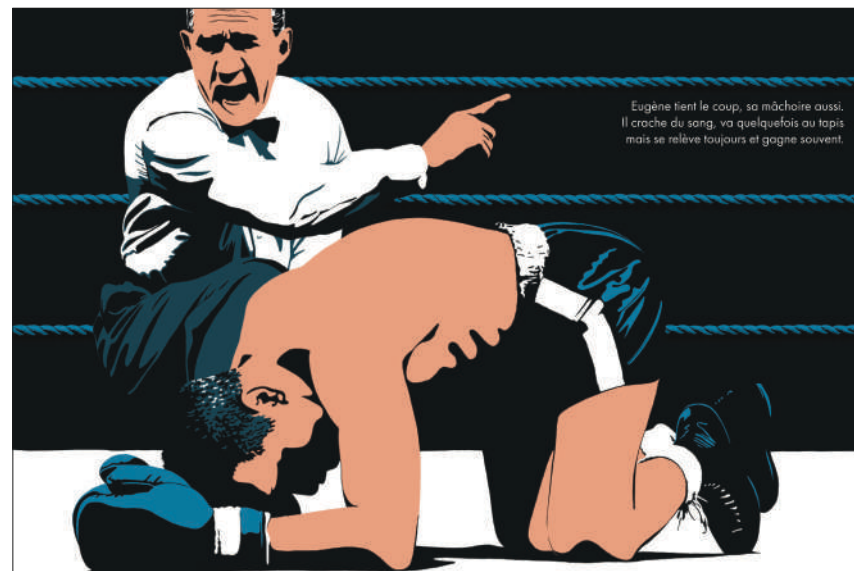
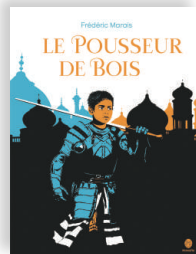

Tino. A garden blackbird

by Nicolas Jolivot

A blackbird lives in my garden, or maybe it's the other way round! Far from describing an anonymous bird, the author invites us into Tino's life. Unique and moving.

In his previous book *Travelling in my garden* (see next page) published in 2021, Nicolas Jolivot wrote: «Now I'm sure of it, Tino is talking to me. I hardly dare tell this story. People are going to think that the garden

makes me quietly blissful».

Three years later, this is the story he tells us, the story of his year-long connection with a blackbird that recognises him.

It's an unexpected, contemplative, surprising and moving journey that teaches us a thousand things about blackbirds... and even more about Tino! The remarkable specificity of this book lies in the exceptional and, to date, largely unprecedented experience, not of the ornithological observation of a specimen in its environment, but of the attentive daily contact with an individual in its existence.

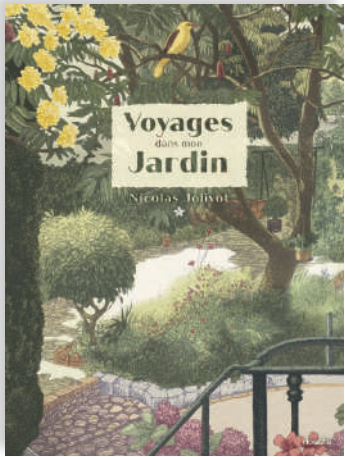

In 2021, his remarkable *Voyages dans mon jardin* (p. 14) was published, and won several awards in its turn.

Autumn 2019. After years of travelling the world, Nicolas Jolivot decides, in an incredible anticipation of confinement, to stay at home for a year with the project of travelling in his garden.

A 200 year old living garden. On the occasion of this anniversary, it is through the medium of time that the author traces the portrait of this piece of land and all that inhabits it, living or memories.

In addition to the inherent quality of Nicolas Jolivot's writing and drawing, already recognized by literary awards, Hong Fei Cultures supports this project for its resonance with the current events that the whole world has been living intensely since the outbreak of the coronavirus pandemic last January.

In a sort of incredible anticipation, Nicolas Jolivot, tireless globe-trotter, had decided last year to stay at home for twelve months with the project of traveling in his garden. This is not a gesture of repentance that abandons a blind globalization to embrace a narrow localism, but a continuity in the eyes of this explorer of the world: an intelligent and sensitive return to one's interiority opens the perspectives of a healthy relationship with the world. When our vision and mentality evolves, new practices, more inclusive of all living beings, will have a better chance of taking root.

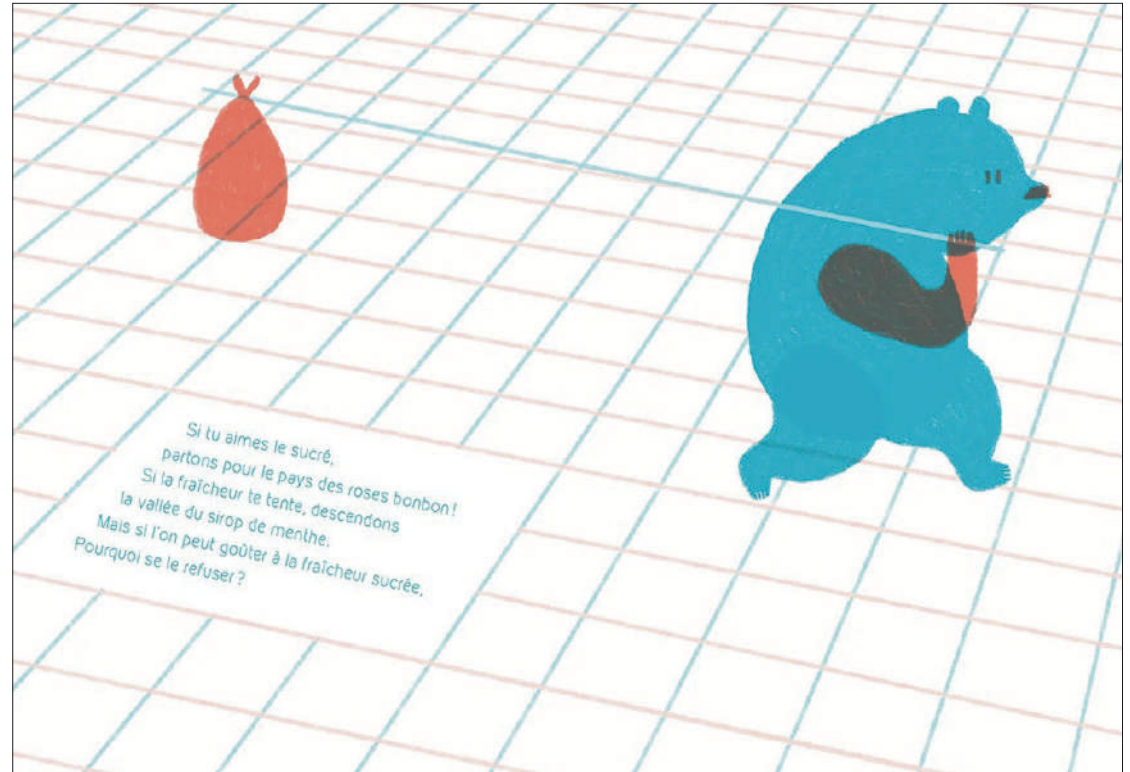
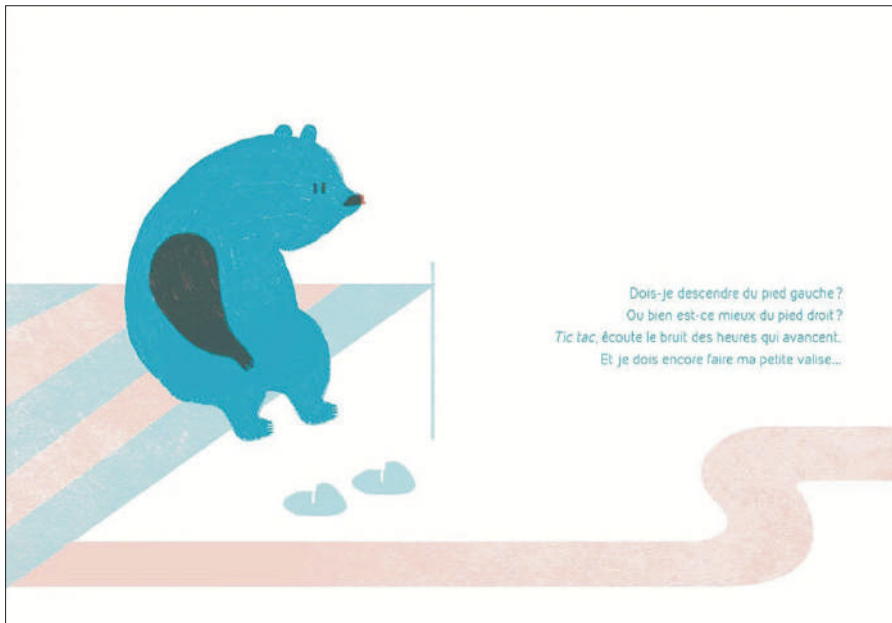
An initiatory journey, poetic and gentle

An experience of time told with simplicity and efficiency in a small story featuring a flower, a bee and a snail. Time passes, but it doesn't take away everything in its path. 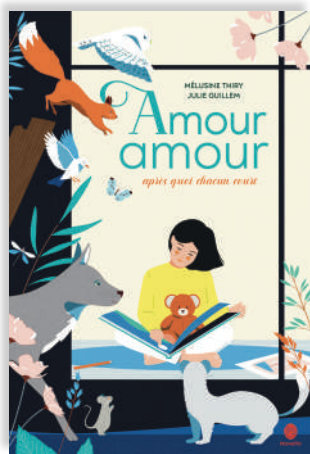
AMÉLIE CARPENTIER

A vast forest stretches across Mount Takara in Japan. Akio's father is its guardian. Akio likes to accompany him along the narrow paths where the animals have

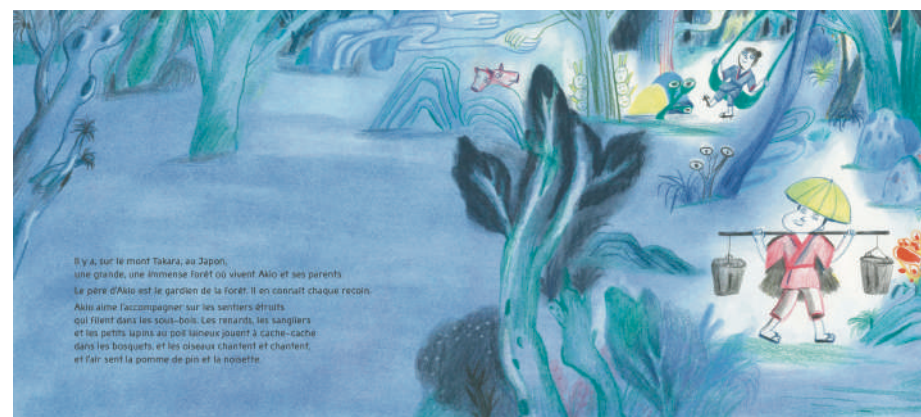
